



Code of Conduct – Dancers

BrosnaCan Academy is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well being of all dancers, teachers and volunteers associated with the school. To ensure the effective running of the Academy and to protect all individuals connected with the school it is important that the following codes of conduct are read, signed, respected and adhered to at all times:

General:

- Dancers must participate within the school rules and respect all the teachers and their decisions.
- Dancers must respect their fellow school dancers - Dancers must NOT distract or harass other dancers during the class. BULLYING will not be tolerated and dancers will be asked to leave the Academy upon immediate affect.
- Dancers must arrive for training on time or inform the Academies secretary (Charlotte San) if they are going to be late or absent.

Class Rules:

- **Dancers must bring a drink with them** (either water or juice). Food may only be consumed after lessons have finished. Chewing gum is strictly prohibited.
- Please leave all valuables at home – BrosnaCan Academy will not be held responsible for the loss of any items.
- Mobile phones and other electronic devices must be switched off and put away during class.
- Dancers must be respectful of the hall/studio and equipment.
- Dancers must inform the Dance Teacher **immediately** if they begin to feel ill or sustain an injury before warm ups or during the class.
- Dancers must remain with teachers at the end of the class until their parent or guardian safely collects them.
- Under no circumstances should steps or routines be shown to anyone outside of class.
- Crying in class will not be acknowledged! If you feel frustrated have a talk with the teachers. Continuous crying will result in dance teachers asking you to sit out of class.
- FINALLY ALL DANCERS MUST ENTER THE CLASS WITH A SMILE!!

DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE

Dancers that breach the code of conduct will be given a verbal warning and will result in the parents being informed at the end of the class by the Dance Teacher to discuss the situation. Continuous breach of the code of conduct will result in exclusion of the child from the Academy.



Code of Conduct – Competition

BrosnaCan Academy is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all dancers, teachers and volunteers associated with the school. To ensure the effective running of the Academy and to protect all individuals connected with the school it is important that the following codes of conduct are read, signed, respected and adhered to at all times:

- Bad sportsmanship of any kind will not be tolerated.
- We are supportive of fellow dancers at all times. We are happy and proud of their achievements at competitions.
- We will not boast or 'show off' as this is disrespectful.
- At competitions, we are representing BrosnaCan Academy and the way we act is a reflection of the Academy's values.
- We understand that the adjudicator has the final say.
- During competitions, dancers must respect their fellow dancers. Dancers must NOT distract or harass dancers during the competition.
- We will not talk about our teachers in a negative manner or question their decisions.
- We are to wear our school 'Adidas' uniform at all feiseanna and dance events.
- During results, we are to sit with our team members in one group, no sitting with parents and cheer for everyone.
- We are expected to congratulate our fellow competitors even if they are not from our school.
- **Crying or sulking** at competitions will not be acknowledged unless injury has occurred. Crying repeatedly at competitions will result in a ban from the next competition.

Code of Conduct – Parents

BrosnaCan Academy is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all dancers, teachers and volunteers associated with the school. To ensure the effective running of the Academy and to protect all individuals connected with the school it is important that the following codes of conduct are read, signed, respected and adhered to at all times:

General:

- Ensure dancers arrive to training on time and inform the Academies secretary (Charlotte San) if your child is going to be late or absent.
- Ensure your child is dressed appropriately and that long hair is tied back.
- Provide your child with enough water/juice to last their lesson.
- No parent or guardian will be allowed into the hall/studio during classes (with the exception of Sunday classes and selected Saturday's).
- Teachers are not to be addressed during the class.
- Children are not to be 'coached' from the side line by parents.
- Children are to be collected promptly at the end of class.

Conduct:

- Encourage your child to learn the rules and perform within them.
- Help your child recognise good performance and progression. Encourage them to accept responsibility for their own performance.
- Be realistic with regards to your child's ability and do not set expectations too high. It can be very damaging to children if they feel they are falling short of their parents' expectations.
- Discourage comparison to other dancers. Each dancer is individual, with individual goals and objectives and must be praised on their own personal achievements.
- Never force your child to take part. Children must participate for their own pleasure and enjoyment and not their parents.
- Do not talk negatively about other dancers, parents, schools or teachers at class or at competition. Everything can be overheard and this behaviour will not be tolerated. Set a good example by recognising good sportsmanship.
- We are a team. We expect parents to work together for and at events and feiseanna. Parents are expected to sit together at competitions, not in separate groups.
- If transferring your child to another dance school, the steps of BrosnaCan Academy must not be shown. These steps are individually choreographed and legal action may be taken.
- Before making purchases relating to dancing, parents should seek advice from the dance teachers. If something is purchased without confirmation, do not expect it to be worn at a competition.
- At competitions, parents should under no circumstances approach or talk to adjudicators.

Social Media:

- Videoing in class is **strictly prohibited** unless you've been asked to for a dancer to practise steps or routines.
- Any videos on social media that demonstrate the Academy's steps will result in a **verbal warning**. Any parent wishing to post via social media regarding the Academy must ask the dance teachers first.
- Parents should not video record at competitions exceptions to this is results, parades and overall competitions. Any parent found to be recording will not be invited to the next competition.

Fees:

- All fees must be paid on time. After 2 missed payments children will not be able to take part in the class unless their fees have been met.

DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE

A breach of this code of conduct may result in a verbal warning. Your child/children risk loosing their place at the Academy.

Code of Conduct – Sunday Class Dancers

BrosnaCan Academy is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all dancers, teachers and volunteers associated with the school. To ensure the effective running of the Academy and to protect all individuals connected with the school it is important that the following codes of conduct are read, signed, respected and adhered to at all times:

General:

- Dancers should be at class every Sunday for training at your grade. If you are unable to attend Eva must be notified the Wednesday prior. Failure to notify Eva within this period means class MUST still be paid for. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- Sunday classes are strictly for Intermediate/Open dancers or invited dancers ONLY.
- Three Sunday classes per month are compulsory for Championship dancers. Those dancers who leave 40 miles away or further can attend two.
- Classes are held one Sunday at Dagenham and three at Crystal Palace. You can attend any three of your choice. Dancers are encouraged to do all four.
- Practice outside class is expected at championship level.

Conduct:

- Always be respectful to your dance teachers. No back talking or attitude will be tolerated.
- Parents must not use their phones and noise is to be kept to a minimal.
- Parents who 'train on the side' will be asked to leave.
- Steps are individually choreographed and legal action may be taken if they are shown or repeated to others outside of the class. Steps are STRICTLY not to be repeated.
- Dancers must bring 100% to each class.
- Before making purchases relating to dancing, dancers should seek advice from the dance teachers. If something is purchased without confirmation, do not expect it to be worn at a competition.

Social Media:

- Videoing in class is **strictly prohibited** unless you've been asked to for a dancer to practise steps or routines.
- Any videos on social media that demonstrate the Academy's steps will result in a **verbal warning**. Any parent wishing to post via social media regarding the Academy must ask the dance teachers first.

Dress Code:

- Dance teachers shoe choice is final.
